National survey of children, The Big Ask

The new Children's Commissioner for England, Dame Rachel de Souza, has today launched <u>The Big Ask</u> – the largest ever consultation with children aged 4 to 17 in England. It aims to find out children's concerns and aspirations about the future, so that we can put children at the heart of our country's recovery from the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak.

Parents, care leavers and those working with children are invited <u>to complete the adult survey</u> to share their views about the future for children and young people today, and what they think is holding young people back.

The results from this survey will help the Children's Commissioner identify the barriers preventing children from reaching their potential, put forward solutions and set ambitious goals for the country to achieve.

<u>Covid 19</u>

I am certain that we are all looking forward to the increase in freedoms that will come through May and June, however, guidance in school is that we need to remain with our current risk assessment. Our classes are in 'bubbles' for lessons and play times and we are maintaining a strict handwashing and cleaning regime. With a few cases in our area though, I would like to remind everyone of our process in the event of a suspected or positive case.

If your child has one of the three main symptoms of Covid -19, please do not bring them to school but seek a PCR test. If your child starts with symptoms at school, we will contact you to collect your child to seek a PCR test. Once your test results are received, positive will result in a period of 10 days self-isolation and negative will mean your child can return to school. I would like to ask that you always keep school informed so that we can make decisions for test and trace. We know how frustrating similar symptoms for hay fever and summer colds can be, but we are required to be consistent in our approach.

If we have a positive case in school, we will be asked to close the class bubble and any other bubble that the child is part of. This may involve the Hub, after school sports clubs etc. We want to be able to balance the risk of these additional bubbles also having to self- isolate with continuing to offer pupils opportunities. There is no doubt that the impact of a positive case could be felt by many families if it happens but we sincerely hope that it doesn't.
