INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Dear Parents,

I would like to take the opportunity to thank Class 2 for their fabulous learning skills and behaviour throughout the class teacher recruitment process. They have been amazing! We have been impressed with all candidates and will be in a position to confirm the successful candidate and outline our staffing structure very soon.

This week would have been the Year 6 Statutory Assessment week (SATs). We will continue to help them become 'High School Ready' through our lessons and teacher assessments and help them have the self-confidence and vision to be the best version of themselves.

In addition, we would like to thank the PTFA for subsidising the Year 6 leavers hoodies. These have been ordered and will hopefully be able to be presented before the end of this half term.

Sporting events and lifts

A huge thank you for the number of parents who have said they can help us with transporting children to TASA (our cluster sporting events). We really couldn't offer these enrichment opportunities without your help. The school office will arrange a DBS for all those on the list as a safeguarding precaution and we would like to thank parents for giving their consent for parents to help in this way.

Colds

Thank you to everyone for their understanding under the current Covid restrictions in the event their child is displaying a cough or cold. We are following the guidance of the Government, when we ask whether your child has a consistent cough as we do understand that often children (and adults) have coughs and summer colds at this time of year. If your child's cough is a consistent cough, we will ask you to stay off school and seek a PCR test. Even if they had taken a lateral flow, with the main symptoms of Covid, we are obliged to ask you to get a test to rule out Covid. Lateral flow testing is designed for asymptomatic people and the guidance at this time states we cannot use this as proof that they are not Covid positive. Fingers crossed as we approach June 21st that we stay on course for lifting the restrictions.

The 'A Confident ME' parenting workshop supports parents in helping your child to become their best self.
