# Parental Questionnaires

I will send an outline of the positive and development points in the next couple of weeks as the Local Authority analysis will only be available next year.

Every fortnight on Wednesdays, we are fortunate to have a wonderful friend to Bretherton come in to lead our Worship. His worships are thoroughly entertaining and inspirational. Children engage in his stories and are always willing participants in his sessions. We are delighted to share the great news that Brian was nominated and was awarded The British Empire Medal for service to the community which is fantastic recognition for the hard work and commitment he has to others. He was invited to receive it at Lancaster Castle and next year will attend a Buckingham Palace tea party. He explained to our children that he felt his hard work was a calling from God and that he didn't expect recognition because he felt it was the right thing to do. However, all of us at school are thrilled and delighted for Brian and his family.

#### **Remembrance** Day

Our Ethos team will be hosting their very first worship at 9.05 on Thursday for Remembrance Day. Please note it is being held on Thursday and NOT Friday as the hall wouldn't be free due to our Toddler session. Within this worship, they will look at the reasons for Remembrance, consider conflicts past and present and ask children to share with you their dreams for future peace. They have worked incredibly hard to create their own presentation, prayers and have chosen the songs and I am sure that they will present such an important message with clarity and respect. We would love you to come and share this with us.

We would also like to invite you to Bretherton's Remembrance Day walk on Sunday from St. John's Church at 10.15am. We will be placing our Poppies on the Memorial and it would be great if you could all come along.

#### Friendship Week

For a whole week, week commencing 14<sup>th</sup> - 18<sup>th</sup> November, we will be enriching our curriculum by holding a 'Friendship week'. This will be a great week for staff and pupils as we really unpick what it means to be a good friend. We will be looking at how to be a good friend, what to do when friendship breaks down and the tools to resolve problems. We are welcoming many visitors in school over the week as we look at how team work, emotions and problem solving can help build, maintain and sustain relationships. We would also like to invite you into school on Friday 18<sup>th</sup> November 2016 at 2.40 as each class will share with you their week long learning. It's sure to be a great end to a great week. #### Our Value this term

This half term our focus value is 'Generosity' and then will lead into 'Advent' for Christmas preparations. We will be looking at generosity of thoughts, actions, time and spirit. We are fortunate to have a special worship lead by Mr Neville Norcross on Monday 28<sup>th</sup> November 2016.

#### Cash payments

It is very important to us that we provide an excellent service and following a review of how payments are sent into school e.g dinner money, milk, toast, trips etc. we would like to inform you of our revised procedures for dealing with cash in the school office:

1. Any payments sent into school must be in an envelope marked with the child's name, class, how much is inside and what it is for.

2. There should be a separate envelope for each payment e.g. £11 in one for dinner money, £8.60 in another for toast. If paying for more than one child then these can be added together in one envelope for each payment. It is requested that the correct money should be in each envelope.

3. All payments should be sent in with the child to be put in the register box at registration to then be forwarded to the school office.

4. Once monies have been received in the office, a receipt will be issued via text message. Texts for receipt of dinner money will be sent out on a Friday only as this is the day that dinner money is dealt with.

5. School cannot be held responsible for payments made direct to organisations e.g. photograph orders whereby your payment is put in a sealed envelope to be opened by the organisation not the school office.

We really appreciate your co-operation and support in implementing this and are confident that it will benefit both school and our families. We are looking into offering an alternative cashless system also so in the future you may be able to pay direct to school.

#### Golden Time

After talking to the children and staff about Golden time, we have decided to review what it should be like in the future. Golden Time is designed as a celebration of children's success. Children usually earn their Golden Time by working hard and keeping the school rules and it is a special time for everyone to look forward to. Children who have worked hard all week are rewarded with time where they can enjoy a variety of different fun and exciting activities and usually children from different classes come together for it.

While we find out from children what they would enjoy and like to do and discuss the options through our parent forums, we would like to tweak it starting this term. Our Golden time will stay on Friday from 2.30-3.00 and will have a number of great clubs which will be planned and provided by staff. We are sure that our children will enjoy sharing their skills with each other and they have already said that they love being with children from other classes. Staff can't wait as they really enjoy working with pupils who are not in their class and the clubs are set to be great fun. While we design our new Golden Time, we will all work hard to ensure Golden Time is just as enjoyable for everyone!

#### End of Day Procedures

It is really important to us that your children are safe and that at the end of the school day, we can ensure that all children are handed over to their parents or parent's representative. With this in mind, our teachers would like to accompany the children out to the playground at 3.15 (except class 1 who will continue to be released to their parents at the 'porch' door). It will be a great opportunity for parents and their child's class teacher to have a chat if appropriate and will also ensure a smooth transition as all pupils will come out from the same door and be available in the same area. No children will leave school from the front door except when a club ends e.g. football, netball, cooking etc. after school has finished. If you would like your child to walk home regularly on their own, please send a letter into school or if only occasionally a note on those days to their teacher. If we could ask you to help us by waiting inside the playground near the main road, we can be sure that the end of the day goes smoothly. Thank you, I am sure that you understand that your child's safety is paramount and this will help us with this. If you have any questions, I would be more than happy to answer them.

#### **Rainy Mornings**

As we are approaching winter and the weather will become more inclement, we wanted to make coming into school easier for you on rainy days. If it is significantly raining before school, at 8.45 the teacher on duty will stand at the gate on the playground and direct your child into their classroom through their classroom door around the back of school. This will mean that you can say your goodbyes at the playground gate, know they are safely in the building when you continue with your day. This will also mean that the school reception area will be clear and office staff available for your enquiries. I'm sure this will be needed more and more this term so again, if you have any questions or concerns please don't hesitate to ask.

#### **Parent Forum Invitation**

Attached to this newsletter is an invitation to become a part of the school's Parent Forum. The Parent Forum is an excellent way for you to put forward your views about how things are going at school in a relaxed and informal way which will help us find ways to improve. It will meet five times throughout the year and each time we will have a discussion point e.g. homework, parents evening, safeguarding, trips etc. but will also look at any other issues raised by parents.
