Swimming

We are lucky enough to provide swimming for the whole year and for 2 year groups each year. Typically swimming is provided for 1 year group and for only 2 terms. I feel that swimming is a life skill that schools are right to provide and as long as our budget allows, we will continue to offer this enhanced provision. However, I do believe it is important that we encourage life saving skills such as swimming at an earlier age and so after recommendations from Tarleton swimming teachers, we are going to review the age group of children who go swimming in this next half term. Swimming assessments will be completed to ensure that they hold in excess of the national standards expectation for their age. Then a decision will be made as to the age and classes that are most in need of this fantastic provision. I'll keep you updated on the outcomes. For this half term, however, Year 4 and 5 will continue to swim on Monday afternoons and will be accompanied by 2 members of staff. If I could ask you to please ensure that your children have all their kit in school on Mondays.
