Curriculum and subject leadership

We are reviewing our curriculum this year to ensure that it is full of knowledge and fit for application of skills. Our broad curriculum does develop the children's spiritually, morally, socially and culturally through RE and other subjects. Our staff have been developing their roles as subject leaders, creating a vision for progression within their subjects, supporting staff development and evaluating effectively the impact of teaching on children's learning. High standards are set for all subjects and coverage is checked. Further assessment opportunities and criteria have been planned for in the spring term to measure progress in. Maths reasoning, wellbeing, spellings, handwriting schemes and reading comprehension will continue to be our focus and success in reading comprehension for Year 6 will be closely monitored and resources purchased throughout school.

English and Maths

All of our children are now following the new English and Maths curriculum which outlines Age Related Expectations within each year group. We will ensure our website offers links to opportunities to develop these areas at home and through our monitoring and evaluation of teaching and learning will continue to offer an enriched curriculum with these areas woven within. Grammar and spelling are being explicitly taught as well as opportunities to teach them through key texts. Reading and in particular guided reading and home reading texts will be our next focus to ensure a high quality of texts are offered. Through self evaluation we are developing children's ability to reflect and develop their own learning more.

Sport and fitness

Our lunch time sports leader roles are developing through the support and guidance of our Lunch time sports coach. This has proved a 'winning formula' in recent cricket, swimming, athletic and gymnastic events. Developing team work, communication and relationships, their role is to provide children with the opportunity to set fitness targets and children the confidence to work independently towards them.

Children will begin to be encouraged to set their own goals to achieve their personal best. Our swimming provision will be reviewed to support younger swimmers.

Building
