<u>Curriculum and subject leadership</u>

This year we will focus on science and engineering as our subject enrichment. Through effective questioning and investigations, children will develop their independent understanding of these subjects and through trial and error, will develop resilience. We will offer a creative week linked to science skills and geographical investigations full of visitors and 'wow' experiences. A careers week will offer a better understanding of jobs and how education leads to career choices. linked to money education and citizenship. Our last creative days will be linked to the brain, how it works to develop children's understanding of how we learn, the importance of growth and positive mindsets and importance of resilience in learning. Subject leaders will continue to lead effective subjects in all classes to ensure a high quality provision and opportunities for all. Practical and concrete resources to be considered and through developing our understanding of memory and links in learning, we aim to help children's learning 'stick'. We aim to offer a curriculum which meets the needs of Bretherton children with a balance of knowledge and application skills. We will update our teaching and learning policy to promote curiosity and through questioning stretch breadth of understanding.

English and Maths

Last year we focused on enhancing our maths curriculum with concrete resources, mastery approaches, encouraging children to be fluent in concepts so they can answer problems in many different forms. This will continue to be embedded whilst our new focus is a balance of reading and writing opportunities.

Developing children's use of language and word choices, teachers will maximise opportunities for comprehensions. This will also support spellings and the teaching of grammar. We will plan a timetable of 'WOW' opportunities to stimulate writing and encourage imagination. Children writing about topics they are interested in will encourage sustained writing and through learning how to effectively edit their text, children will maximise progress through quality writing opportunities.
