Medicine-important information

At this time of year, there is often coughs and colds and using our medicine policy, we will be able to administer medicine after you have competed the necessary form. It is important that the medicine is handed into an adult in school and not in your child's bag. It is important that sachets and bottles are not available to other children by accident. If we find or know of any in bags, we will return them to you on collection. Thank you for helping us keep your children safe.

Smart Technology Watches and other internet enabled devices.

There was a time when a watch only told the time, but with the advancement of technology, watches today can count your steps, set alarms, access the internet and some make phone calls and answer messages. Unfortunately, for obvious reasons, we cannot allow such devices to be brought into school – for similar reasons that we do not allow mobile phones. Therefore please can we request that 'SMART Watches' are left at home (such as Apple Watches, Google watches, Samsung Galaxy etc.).

'Normal' watches and the more simple 'Fitbit' devices are acceptable. Many of our children are sporting 'fitbit' style watches which they received for Christmas. Wearing one myself, I know how good they can be in promoting physical activity and fitness and are a great way for children to ensure they maximise physical activity at break and lunchtimes. I can see in the future a day when we use such devices as a school to complement our PE curriculum. However, it is important that they are not a distraction or stop children from concentrating or learning within class. If this happens, they may be asked to stop wearing it. If they are used for their intended purpose and don't interfere with learning, I believe they will be a great asset to your child's maths, statistics and wellbeing education. Thank you for your support with this—it will be much appreciated.

Reduce, Recycle and Reuse our books

In the spirit of our wish to 'Make a Difference' we would like to invite you to reduce the number of used reading books in your house, you know the ones that you've ready many, many times and that you keep just in case. They have thoroughly investigated all reports of attempts to defraud parents using our system (including separate, independent checks) and can confirm that they found that no fraud, data breach or malicious attack has occurred. It's a good time therefore to remind you to be extra vigilant when making payments online. NEVER give out your ATM pin to anyone – no system or person should ever require this to complete an online transaction. If something looks suspicious, do not complete the payment, close down your browser and start again making sure you are using a genuine website.
