INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Dear Parents,

Although we have had a number of positive cases in school, we would like to thank you for your support in seeking PCR tests when displaying symptoms and regularly using LFT testing. Despite their being no Government guidance on self isolating for children under 18 and in the absence of track and trace in schools, we would like to thank you for your thoughtful approach in our attempt to reduce the spread of Covid whilst maintaining school and education. There are rising cases in our area and this can be seen within local schools. By employing the additional preventative measures, we will get on with our job of teaching. Thank you to staff for their hard work through this challenging time.

Anti-bullying Week

This week has been National Anti-bullying Week and all week we have been teaching children about what makes a good friend, how to be kind, and what is important in maintaining relationships. Teachers have been looking at bullying, what it is and why it can happen, who they can tell and what happens next and the children have been positive participators. They also looked great in their odd socks as part of the 'One Kind Word' event this year.

Asthma Policy

We have updated our Asthma policy and would ask you to familiarise yourself with it if your child has been diagnosed with asthma. If we could ask parents to keep us updated of any changes to your child's needs, encourage older children to have an inhaler on their possession and know how to use and a spare inhaler in school for them in the event of emergencies or trips. Staff undergo annual training on how to support children with Asthma and we regularly use updates from Asthma UK. We are looking at creating an asthma plan for each child to enable parents to provide more information about their child's needs and we will be sending this out before the end of the year if you can complete it and return it to school.
