#### **Excellent Behaviour**

After every holiday, we remind our children about what it is to be a Bretherton pupil. We look at our Bretherton Golden Rules and how we can make positive choices about our behaviour. We are fortunate to children who know how to be respectful and make those positive choices and this is promoted by a consistent and nurturing approach from staff who model the behaviour we are looking for from our children. All adults in school understand that as children develop their ability to self regulate their behaviour, they take more responsibility for their choices and by encouraging children on this journey, they will demonstrate respect, self control and self awareness all through their education. To create a harmonious and happy school, we have fun together, work hard in learning, walk calmly around school, are kind to others, look after resources and communicate respectfully with each other. I have attached our Golden rules to this newsletter so you are aware of our expectations and on Fridays for 30 minutes, children who have consistently displayed them will get their 'Golden Time'. If children have chosen not to follow them, they can lose some of their Golden Time and will reflect on their behaviour and make a plan for improvement the next week. ### Winter weather approaching

With the frosty weather appearing this week, I would like to take the opportunity to inform you about our snow and gritting arrangements. Our school is on a 'primary gritting route' and so although roads in winter can be difficult to use (especially first thing in the morning), this should minimise this. If the weather is significantly bad around school, we will text as soon as practicable to advise you. If for any reason there is a risk that school cannot open, we will inform LCC, local radio and text and email parents as soon as practicable. This is an extreme situation and the decision would never be taken lightly. The safety of you, your children and staff will underpin such a decision.

For cancellations, please could you ensure that you inform Kelly the week before so that the places can be filled by others.

## Free School Meals and Pupil Premium

If you are a family in receipt of qualifying benefits, your child may be entitled to Free School Meals and an additional pupil premium grant of £1300 which is paid directly to school. If you receive any of the following benefits, you may qualify:

Income Support; Income Support Jobseekers Allowance; Income Related Employment and Support Allowance

Support under part VI of the Immigration Asylum Act 1999; The guaranteed element of state pension credit

Child tax credit (provided you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have a gross income of less that £16190)

Working Tax Credit run on—paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Universal Credit; Children who get the above credits in their own right

There are also additional categories of pupil premium funding for children who are looked after by the local authority or who have been adopted, and children of service families. If you think you may be eligible, please go to https://www.gov.uk/apply-free-school-meals

We have seen children increase in confidence and ability by using the packages little and often and it would be great if this could be seen in all children from Year 2 and above.
