Attendance

Autumn term is always a tricky time for coughs, colds and illnesses and I would like to thank you for helping prevent the spread of illnesses through good hygiene. However, our whole school attendance has fallen below 97% this term so far and so would like to ask that wherever possible any absences in school time are avoided.

This also relates to medical appointments, dentists and opticians. If you can try and book these in holiday time or in the afternoons as often children can miss crucial maths and English if they come in late in the morning sessions. Thank you for your support.

Supporting Learning

We **NEED** your support for volunteer helpers in school to read with our children. Early reading is so important for children's success in education and to be able to read with children on a daily basis is so important but we are not always able to achieve this without the help of volunteers. If you feel you can commit regular support, even if an hour a week, we would really appreciate your help.

Parent Supporting Learning

Part of our homework in Class 2,3 and 4 is for children to spend time on computer packages 'Spelling Shed' and 'Times Table Rock Stars'. As little as 10 minutes a day on these packages can make a huge difference to your child's ability to recall this knowledge and become more accurate in its application. We appreciate the need to restrict 'screen' time for children but this fun and interactive way of learning and consolidating can really help their progress in school.

Also your child's teacher will be discussing reading at home at Parent's Evening and we appreciate you spending time reading with and to your child each day. Reading really does open up opportunities within all aspects of the curriculum.

'Reading is to the mind what exercise is to the body.' If you need any support in helping your child at home, please let us know.
