INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Dear Parents,

<u>Covid</u>

As we face another round of guidance notes and possible changes to our routines, I would like to thank our parents, staff and children for working with us to navigate this term. We have not had any further positive cases for over 5 days, however, with the extent of cases in other local schools and our community, positive cases will be something that we may need to ready for. Thank you to parents for monitoring symptoms within the family and acting swiftly in testing when symptoms were displayed. In addition, we know that many families are conducting regular lateral flows (as staff are in school) and this is helping prevent the spread and identifying some asymptomatic cases. If anyone in your household has any of the 3 main symptoms, we will ask you to book a PCR as LFT are only to be recommended for individuals with no symptoms. Thank you for your support. Keeping school open is our top priority as long as it fits alongside safeguarding children and staff. If you have any questions, please feel free to call the school office and we will try and help.

With the press coverage of the new variant, we will remain in bubbles where possible, continue step 2 enhanced cleaning and follow the guidance on face coverings in school by staff in communal areas and visitors. Regular handwashing, sanitiser and ventilation will continue. We will of course keep you updated if anything changes or we have any further cases.

Google classroom

We never know what is around the corner and we are really fortunate to have the use of Google classroom in the event of home learning. This may come into play if a child is off self isolating or if we go into another lockdown (fingers crossed not). However most classes may post homework and learning on during term time and it's a great way to communicate with families and children about their learning. So if we could encourage all parents to know what their child's google classroom login and password is. Many families write it in the reading record so they can be accessed by the child in school and home, it will really help in the event of needing to use. Children in class 1 or 2, who may not have accessed in school may need to join the class for 2021 2022. This is a simple click when you login. If you or your child has any problems accessing it, please let the school office know.

Learning at home

If your child is off school with Covid and / or is required to self isolate for 10 days, the class teacher will set some work for them on Google classroom. They will try and make this independent work , however we appreciate due to the age of some children, this may not be possible. However, if your child is unwell, please do not worry about completing it.

Class 1 and 2 production
