Attendance and Lateness

Our school attendance rate for Autumn term is 96% and Lancashire guidelines are 97%. We always know that sickness and colds can cause our attendance data to fall this term but I do need to ask for your support in not booking activities and holidays within term time. Another issue that can avoid disruption to learning, is punctuality. We have an increasing number of children who are regularly late. Although 5 or 10 minutes doesn't sound a lot in a day of learning, being late can often delay lessons, cause the child anxiety as they are entering the classroom once the day routines have started, be distracting for others or worse still it may mean your child misses their opportunity to read or work with an adult in a planned activity. Homework

There are many documented opinions on the purpose and benefit of homework and we have seen many educational changes that could have left you confused. However, at Bretherton Endowed, we feel that homework allows children to practice and apply learning in class is invaluable in supporting learning in school. We believe reading at home is one of those essential experiences and even when you feel that your child is a fluent reader, your questioning and discussions around the book can really help with their comprehension and inference skills. We have also seen that children using Times Table Rock Stars and Spelling Shed regularly, even for 10 minutes a day, are noticing the positive difference in their classwork. Thank you for your help in supporting your child's learning in this way. If we can do anything to help you, let us know . Let's see how much difference homework can really make!

Changes to our Key Stage 2 residentials 2020/2021

After speaking to our children, we would like to outline how we would provide those enriching and extra curricular experiences from this year. In Year 4/5 we would like to take the class to Hothersall Lodge, a Lancashire County Council, outdoor pursuits location near Longridge in the Ribble Valley for 2 days 1 night commencing 2021. The itinerary will include river studies, orienteering, outdoor pursuits, geographical field studies and team building activities which closely meet the National Curriculum expectations for their age and enhances our curriculum in school. This will be booked for March/April each year. This will have a rolling 2 year rolling programme so they have new learning activities each year.

In Year 6, they will continue to have the opportunity to visit Robinwood in February each year and will access the great team building challenges and activities that the children love. This will ensure that this visit is special and experienced in their last year at school with their friends.

This provision is a great way of maximising National Curriculum coverage and also offering fabulous experiences. The current Class 3 and 4 parents have received a separate letter highlighting the opportunities for their children in this first year of transition. Keeping everyone well

There are always coughs and colds at this time and year and we understand if you feel that your child needs medicine to help them. To keep everyone safe, please ensure that any medicine including calpol or medicated lozengers are passed to the School Office and on completion of our medical instruction forms, we will be happy to administer them in accordance with your wishes. It is important that children don't have any undisclosed medication in their bag, just in case used incorrectly. We want to minimise any sickness in school so all classes have been reminded of hand washing and general hygiene. Please ensure that your child has a refillable water bottle in school each day as if not, they may be tempted to share water or inadvertently use dirty cups or beakers. Please remember to prevent the spread of sickness, we would ask that your child returns to school 48 hours after the last sickness.

Winter is here and children will be playing out as much as possible, therefore please ensure that your child has a warm coat, gloves and hat for this chilly season.

<u>Letters</u>

Just a reminder for you from last term. Thank you for using the website for completing consents for school trips and paying via our online payment system. Feedback from parents has been positive for trips and sporting events, however, you seem to prefer to see the Clubs come home as paper copies so that you can sign and return with the £1 per session donations for our clubs and the money for external clubs. So from January, we will send all after school children clubs as letters so please ensure that your children check their bags and pass you the information to help making those decisions. Trips and Sporting Events will continue to be completed online through the website.

Well done to Class 1 and 2 for a fabulous production at the end of the Autumn term. The DVD's will be available mid January. They will be sent home as soon as they arrive in school.

MUGA (Multi Use Games Area)

We are nearly ready to arrange design and construction of our multi use games area that will extend our playground and enable children to play team games all through the year, especially when the field is too wet. Having consulted with our children, they want a larger space where they can play ball games—football, tag rugby, dodgeball to name a few. We will try and ensure that we facilitate this for them. This venture is expected to be funded from a lottery grant and donations.
