Safe parking and speed in Bretherton

Last year our children canvassed Chorley BC in relation to the speeding that occurs in South Road which can put our children and their families in danger. Speaking to Lancashire Police, I have requested that they monitor this more closely in the future in an attempt to reduce speeds to the correct speed limit during school hours.

In addition, we recently had a visit from the Local Authority parking enforcement officers who identified parents parking incorrectly at the start of the school day. This is equally important for keeping everyone safe and they will be here again, so please ensure that you do not stop or park on or opposite the yellow lines and park responsibly away from the corner. The Church car park and area near the Congregational Chapel is available but please remember the school car park is only used by staff and visitors within the school day. Please ensure any parents, grandparents or family friends are aware so they don't get a ticket.

Relationship and Health Education

The Government has outlined their commitment for children to grow up healthy, happy, safe and able to manage the challenges and opportunities of the modern world. So in September 2020, all primary age children will be taught Relationship and Health Education. There has been much publicised in the press regarding this and on occasions concerns have arisen from a lack of clarity of the content to be taught or consultation with parents.

At Bretherton Endowed, we consulted our parents on our Sex and Relationship Education, which forms part of our PHSE (Personal, Health, Social and Emotional) education content 2 years ago and as a result are happy with the age appropriate content that we include. This new focus has some additions but is mostly in line with our current practice. In order to ensure that we are meeting the needs of the curriculum and our parents, we will be sending out a letter and providing a copy of the draft policy on the website for your perusal. We welcome any feedback in relation to any specific content or the links between our developmentally appropriate content and religious background of our pupils. We have sought advice from the Diocese of Blackburn and have worked hard to ensure that this is included within our policy. We will be presenting our final policy and curriculum content to our school Governors at the end of February if you would like to contribute, let me know your views before then. We will then commence the curriculum in the Summer 2020.

Swiss student teachers

Previously, this was a great opportunity for everyone concerned as we learned about education outside the UK and they supported our teaching and learning in class whilst they apply their teacher training in a different setting.
