Special Educational Need Provision at Bretherton

At Bretherton, we pride ourselves in personalising the curriculum to ensure all children succeed. Quality First Teaching means that children's needs are differentiated for and the teachers are skilled in ensuring every child learns and progresses well. Sometimes, children may need a little more than differentiated learning in order to access learning fully and when this happens, we refer to it as having a special educational need (SEND). This may also apply if your child has a disability that school needs to significantly take into account when determining provision. This may be as a result of a diagnosis or it may be because we don't feel the child is progressing in the same way as their peers, despite this personalised approach. If your child is identified as having an additional need, we usually set small step goals and add extra support or planning into their provision. These goals are shared with children so they can continue to take responsibility and work independently and we meet with you to share them and work together in partnership. These documents are often referred to as Personal Development Plans. These are changed according to the successes of the child but are reviewed with parents at least once a term. This gives families and staff a chance to share good practice and to refine future support.

It is vital that we get this right and this partnership is very important to us. So I will be sending home next week a **SEND** questionnaire for parents whose child has a Personal Development Plan to assess our strengths but also gives you a chance to let us know any aspects we can develop further. As the Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator for school, my door is always open so if there is anything you would rather discuss in person, please let me know. If I could ask that the forms are returned by 14/2/20

If we could ask you to have a look at home for any buttons as Class 1 would like to collect some for counting and sorting in Maths. Please pass any you can spare to the school office in a bag or envelope. Thanks.

Keeping safe in cars

Lancashire Fire and Rescue came in this week to speak to Class 4 . Please have a look with your child so they all understand the need for road safety and being safe inside a car.

After School Dance Club

We are fortunate to have a professional dancer agree to lead an after school dance class for children after half term. Louise Ross trained at Merseyside Dance and Drama centre in Liverpool, graduating with a professional dance diploma along with Associate teaching qualifications with the I.S.T.D in Ballet, Modern, National and Disco, and went on to dance professionally for over 10 years all over the world on cruise ships, hotels, casinos, summer seasons, commercial as well as extra work on Hollyoaks. She is very passionate about spreading the love of dance to children and seeing their confidence, talent and love for the art grow. The club will be open for Year 3,4,5,6 initially and we are hoping that we may be able to offer a kS1 club in the future. The club will run on Monday after school 3.15—4.15 , for 5 weeks at a cost of £3.50 per week so total cost of £17.50 for the whole session. This has been subsidised through our commitment to obtaining the Arts Mark.

Teaching in Class 4

After half term, there will be a slight change in teaching commitment in class 4. On Friday's Mrs Moxham will be teaching year 6 all day, with Mrs Smith continuing to teach Monday—Thursday. This will not affect the quality of teaching and learning in Year 6 and we will work closely together to ensure good transition at the end of the week. However, it will mean that I may not be available during the day to contact or meet with parents or professionals unless urgent. I am excited to start and know as the children are already used to me being in class on Friday afternoon already, they won't really notice a change.

FURTHER INFORMATION

Attendance

The Government requires a schools to promote a high level of attendance. Regular school attendance is very important so that children are given as much opportunity as possible to develop academically and socially. When children are absent from school they often find it difficult to catch up on the work they have missed and can feel unsettled by this. Parents of children whose attendance is below 90% (Pupils whose attendance falls below 90% are classed as being 'Persistently Absent' for the purpose of attendance reporting) will receive a letter to outline this and ask for your help in improving this for the remaining two terms of the year. We do appreciate that many of the absences this year so far may have been due to unavoidable circumstances, such as sickness or appointments. However, I am certain that we can all work together to raise attendance.

Values

We have been made aware of a great resource for children to reflect on our Values and how to display them in their daily lives. Treasure Champs on CBeebies is a great resource to teach children about how to show values in the words and actions—some of you may have already heard of them.
