End of Year letter July 2020

For our Parents and friends,

Well who would have imagined that the end of the school year would look like this and we would have had so long apart from each other. I am in awe of how you have all managed to juggle work; home schooling and looking after loved ones. You will have all achieved so much, more than you will know and have been part of living history.

As we plan for September, we are intending to see all children back in school with our school kitchen open for hot lunches and our out of school provision 'The Hub' open. We have been working on the model of how this will all work in line with Government guidance but I have learned over the last few months that things can change and adapt quite quickly and so I propose to outline this at the end of August so you are kept fully up to date. To reassure you though as you try and plan your working patterns, our plans are for school to commence at the original times 8.50 on the yard and 3.15 finish (although we may revise and use additional entry and exit points into the school grounds to promote parent and children's safety).

There will be some changes that we will have to adapt to but I am determined that these will not detract from the wide and rich education provision that we strive to fulfil. We are still looking at how brass lessons may work, whether we will be able to transport our children to swimming, how school trips and events may be able to go ahead but just as the Government have done with lockdown, we will be able to introduce more things as we can find ways to do them safely.

I have already updated you on the staffing in each classroom. We are fortunate to have highly skilled and motivated staff who have a proven track record of success. We are confident that as part of our 'Reconnect' curriculum starting September, children will be supporting in their education and if they have any gaps, they will be identified and planned for. We have an exciting curriculum ready to launch in September for our foundation subjects, which will really ignite our children's curiosity and love of learning – we cannot wait to share this with you early Autumn term.

Therefore, no more reflecting on the past let us think of a positive and healthy future.

Thank you for your responses to the Education at home provision throughout the last 3 months. We want to ensure that we learn from our experiences, move on with strength in the event of any future situations, also take the positives of the experience, and blend them into our practice. We are delighted that our offering of curriculum planning has met your needs as our teaching and support staff worked hard to follow our curriculum coverage (as much as we could). I have included the analysis of this time in our, the Covid return to school area of the website. All feedback has helped shape our summer offering and what we aim to improve on should home/ school learning be required again.

After school clubs

We have had enquiries from Jujitsu, Art Club, Spanish, and Rugbytots so far as they cannot wait to come back and offer clubs in school. We are working with them to risk assess how we can facilitate this so information on these clubs will be available for when we get back in September.

The Hub

Thank you for those families who responded to our questionnaire regarding needing the Hub for before and after school club. We appreciate your time and although we know that many of you may not know fully what you need, your responses will make it easier for us to plan a provision that will hopefully work for all. We will continue to try and be as flexible as we can but it may be necessary to know a week before the sessions in order to keep an eye on the numbers. Of course, this may change, so I propose to email the risk assessment and plan for the operation of the Hub at the end of August at which time your sessions will be able to be 'booked'. If you have any questions or concerns before that communication, please email me and I will update you with the facts so far.

Phonics assessment in Autumn 2020

The Government has announced that Year 2 will be asked to sit a statutory phonics assessment in Autumn 2020. In its update, the STA said its current proposal is that schools will administer "a past version of the check" to year 2 pupils "during the second half of the 2020 autumn term". Year 2 pupils who meet the expected standard in the autumn check will not be required to complete any further statutory assessments in phonics. Year 2 pupils who do not meet the expected standard in the autumn check will be expected to take the statutory check in June 2021. We are believed to have the flexibility to decide when to administer the check and can choose which version of past materials to use. This information will be submitted to the Local Authority and DFE and we will report to parents along with any next steps in our Spring parents evening. This is not a cause for concern, but a way to celebrate the children's phonetic understanding and the children will not know that it is as assessment – just that it is a fun check-up. Mrs Clarke has added some phonics games to the Education at Home page.

Free cycle training over the summer

For KS2: I am delighted to invite any Year 5, 6 or 7 pupils to our free summer holiday sessions. Level 1 & 2 will be delivered together with Level 1 first in the morning followed immediately by Level 2, which will run over 2 consecutive day after which on the second afternoon Level 3 will be on offer to those wishing to advance. Your own equipment will be required; we are not able to lend any equipment and cycle must be in working order. This year owing to Covid conditions, we are not able to handle equipment. Education at Home over the summer months.

Thank you to all parents who completed our survey regarding the home learning which staff had been setting for children throughout the lockdown period. Children have worked extremely hard these last few weeks and we understand that many of you are now ready for time off schoolwork to be able to recharge your batteries and have time together as a family. As a result, staff will not be setting home learning for children through the homework page where children can log on.

However, there have been some requests for activities that you can do with your child over the school summer holiday to keep their minds active and to help them remember the basic skills in English and maths. We have also put on some transition booklets and activities that you can complete with your child in preparation for the new school year and some activities for outdoor activities and rainy day activities. Some of these include English and maths skills.

As well as these downloadable documents, children still have access to Spelling Shed, Maths Shed and Purple Mash. Spelling Shed will continue to focus on words suitable for your child's year group and there are the high frequency words for practise at home attached on here as a document. Maths Shed will give them access to basic skills and concepts, particularly times tables etc. and on Purple Mash, children can complete an activity of their choice and save it. A 2Do does not need to be set.

We have also included some phonics activities for you to practise particularly with reception, year one and year two children. It is vital they continue to practise the different phonemes.

We hope that you have a busy and fun filled summer and if there is only one activity, you can complete for school, reading each day is important for all children as this supports their writing also in school.
