INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Welcome to our newsletter at the start of the 2020 2021 school year

I do long for a time that I can write a newsletter without starting with an entry on Covid but for the time being I think this may not be the case. I hope not to have to update you with changes too often but want to be able to keep you in the loop as the Government guidance changes. THANK YOU for helping with the one way system at home time. I was worried about children walking on the road edge as they walk around to meet parents and passing other parents at the railings but coming into the playground, socially distancing and walking out along the front of school in the one way system, has already reduced those risks. Thank you for your help and support. If there is anything you are unsure about or you wish to feedback, I am available daily on the gate.

Education at Bretherton

We have returned to school with our re-connect curriculum and children have been given time to share lockdown stories, ask questions, and reflect on their experience of living history. However, having great work ethic and motivated for learning your children have already started revisiting key objectives in Maths and English and their teachers are pleased at how well they are working. Thank you for supporting them throughout home learning as we are confident this will help them get back on track. Homework will commence next week and may involve some elements of Spellingshed; Timetables Rockstars; but teachers will outline them each week.

Supporting our families and community

The Parish Council have been incredibly proactive in their support of our community and families over the Covid lockdown. They have been distributing donations of Morrison's vouchers to families who may need a little help at this time and have tried to secure funding and grants for future support. Over the last two years, the canopy and outdoor area in Reception and our new MUGA have been fully paid for by grants and donations and of course our new reading book scheme and tables in class 3 through your children's sponsorship events. We hope to have some events this term even if they are virtual or in family groups outdoors but we will be creative to try and keep us connected.

Admissions for Reception class 2021

It always seems strange talking about next year when we haven't got our lovely new Reception class in full time but families will be looking at where they may wish their child to go starting September 2021. We are looking into how we can offer tours of the school and are offering half hour slots on Thursday mornings from w/c 28th September so if you are able to ring and arrange a time to visit then we should be able to accommodate this. Information on our school is on the website so you can have a 'virtual' feel of how our school feels day to day. We look forward to showing our wonderful school and are available for any question that you may have. One of our admission criteria is provision of a faith reference which as Churches have been closed is a tricky situation. Luckily, Blackburn Diocese has applied for a variation on behalf of all of their Church of England schools but as yet we have not heard whether this has been agreed. Pre-School

Swimming

West Lancashire Sports Partnership (WLSP) are working hard to resume swimming for schools. They are completing their risk assessment as we speak and we hope to have further information for parents and children of Class 2 who would start swimming on an afternoons once this is finalised. A separate letter will be sent in order for you to get their kit ready but if you have any questions or concerns before they commence, please contact school.

The HUB

It has been lovely to see smiling faces in The HUB in the morning and afternoon sessions. Sadly we are unable to operate The HUB in the same class bubbles as during the day but to try and reduce the risk of mixing, we are forming two bubbles within same area (socially distanced) for class 1 and 2 then class 3 and 4 children. This works well as the children generally like to play with different resources and those resources can be rotated for cleaning. We hope that the children won't notice a significant difference and the staff are in tune with making The HUB a fun, enjoyable yet safe experience.

Attendance and Covid

Thank you for supporting your child's return to school. Thank you to our families for following the guidance regarding keeping your children off school in the event of feeling poorly as we know that the start of the Autumn term always brings its fair share of colds. If your child has any of the prescribed symptoms, please keep them off school and seek a test. If they are unwell, lethargic, bad headaches and generally unwell, we know that you would want to keep them off school until they are better so you can monitor their symptoms and help them get better. Working together we can all stay safe. An additional letter outlining our policy for managing an outbreak is attached to this letter and added to the Covid tab under 'About us' on the website should you need to refer to it. It also outlines the telephone numbers and brief explanation of what happens if you need to go for a test, hopefully to help and reassure you. Thank you for your support and understanding.
