INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Remote learning

This week we have sent out a letter with a work booklet for your child to access should they be off school awaiting the result of a Covid test for themselves or a family member. This is an interim measure should they not be able to attend school. After a day, the class staff will upload work through the Google Classroom platform which will enable children to continue learning at home. We will try and align the work to the work and curriculum that we are offering in school. Staff will be able to see, mark and comment on the work uploaded, however they may not be able to respond straight away as during the day, they have their teaching commitment.

Ofsted interim visits Autumn 2020 on school's return in September

I thought you may be interested to read the interim results of OFSTED's inspections this term. Read it here. They have reported that some children were finding it more difficult to concentrate on their learning than usual, were showing less resilience, for example becoming quickly upset if the work seemed difficult, or giving up more easily and some, they thought, also seemed to have shorter concentration spans than usual and seemed tired.

Our staff team are being encouraging and planning lessons to support academic progress and wellbeing so that children can settle back into our routines. However, we are aware that some of our children may be experiencing some of these points and we are ready to support when necessary. It is important that you let us know if you are concerned in any way as we can work best together.

The HUB

Thank you for resuming bookings at The HUB as it is a resource that we want to be able to continue to offer. I would like to thank Lewis Townley (an ex pupil for those who don't know) for agreeing to work with children at The HUB on a Wednesday afternoon on football skills and facilitating a game. This will be available for any KS2 children attending The HUB on Wednesdays. We are looking at facilitating a dance club through The HUB on another evening and will keep you informed.

Remembrance Day

We are always heavily involved in the Remembrance Day commemorations at Bretherton but we believe this year that Lancashire is asking local areas to avoid gatherings. We have attached a flyer from Rev Michael regarding Remembrance Service on Sunday 8th November but as we cannot gather at the memorial, we will not be gathering as a school. So we will walk to the War Memorial during that week with each class separately to reflect on the impact of war and share in prayers of peace. Two of our Year 6 children will lay our Poppy wreath at the memorial and share our hope for peace in the world. We will continue to support the Royal British Legion in the selling of poppies and other poppy themed items. The price list and objects that may be available (subject to stock) from Monday 2nd November until 11th November. Please could your child bring the correct change in a named envelope labelled RBL so staff know it is for the shop. Unlike other years, our pupil voice groups will be unable to plan and host the stalls but we are pleased we can support a worthwhile cause. If you would like to be involved, we are hoping to place decorated stones at the memorial as we walk down so after our visit, please go to the memorial with your child and share their creativity with them.

Also, the Royal British Legion are asking everyone to put coloured pictures of poppies in the windows of their homes and as a show of respect and gratitude this would be something, as a school, we could all get involved in. I have attached their template for your use should you wish to use it.

Also we will be holding our virtual Remembrance Day worship on 11th November 2020 involving all classes and we will record it so you too can share in our commemorations.

1 to 1 devices

This week we wrote to you with the outline plan for the 1 to 1 touchscreen chrome book device with specification and costs to participate. We understand that this may not be a good time financially for families and we will try and work with you for an affordable option. The main aim of this scheme is to facilitate computing equipment that we have been unable to provide in school (despite attempts in fundraising and falling school budgets) so that Year 2,3,4,5 have access to a device in order to facilitate learning within class and in light of the current situation, it will also maximise learning opportunities at home. We have not included Year 6 in the roll out scheme as we appreciate that they have less than a year in school and we were fortunate to have some chromebooks donated 3 years ago that are now exclusively being used in Year 6 class.

We have opted not to include children in Class 1 in the scheme at the moment and will seek to offer it at a later date as they move through school. I will however, be surveying Class 1 parents in the next couple of weeks to establish who may not have access to a device at home, should their child be at home.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION & DATES FOR DIARY/CLUB INFORMATION

C'est Madame Russell, your French Teacher

I have been so very pleased to meet your children and we are well under way with our weekly French lessons! They have impressed me with their knowledge already and the priority is to create a spark for languages in our activities. We have had quite a bit of fun already discovering France with beautiful clips of villages and towns!

In Years Quatre et Cinq (Year 4 and 5), we welcomed the children with a return to French school song, for which we practised the words carefully, looking for similarities in both our languages. We watched aliens going back to school, listening and reading familiar words but using our detective skills to find the meaning of new words. We did some gymnastics with our jaws, practising all the sounds combinations that we find in French words, while revising numbers and colours. For the Day of Languages, we greeted each other with hellos in many languages, memorising flags too. We looked at the map of Europe and discovered what Euros look like. We started to practise questions and answers with information about our name, age and where we live, which we will record in writing for our first full conversation in French.

In Class 4 (Year 6), we started with the words to a return to school poem with actions, focusing on familiar words and finding cognates. We continued with a bit of 'Histoire de France', explaining the French flag, finding out what it looked like at the time of Kings and Emperors in France. We spotted the Lily flower as the Royal symbol in their everyday life and were able to explain briefly what happened during the French Revolution. For our celebration of the Day of Languages, Y6 explored the map of Europe and the words to a song in 5 languages! They were also offered fun facts brochures all about the EU and its languages. We carried on with a little 'géographie', asking and answering where we live in French in partners and completed our first set of written activities. We will next use cardinal points to describe the precise location of French cities in full sentences!
