IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Pupil Attitude Questionnaire

Thank you to Year 4 and Year 6 who completed the pupil attitude questionnaire in July. This really helps ensure that we are getting it right for children both in their learning and pastoral care.

In Year 4 (current Year 5) their answers were extremely positive with over 50% of questions being the highest possible score. Thank you to our class teachers for getting their experiences right. Some areas a few children felt could be developed were:

'Displays in my classroom help me learn' - a few felt they didn't

'Homework is interesting and useful' - so we will continue to develop this and evolve.

'Feeling left out' a few children felt this, and the vast majority of children felt they were hardly ever bullied in school. This is an area we are committed to continually improve. We are pleased our children feel able to talk openly about their experiences.

In year 6 last year, over 70% achieved the highest positive score which is fantastic. Areas a few children thought could be improved were:

'My school encourages me to think about the dangers of drinking alcohol and using drugs' and 'worrying when things go wrong' as they didn't score as highly as others for either boys and girls and so we will ensure through our PHSE action plan this year (developing positive mindsets and teaching how to be a responsible citizen), we will improve these areas for children in school now.

Overall a great positive result from our astute and articulate children. Thank you to everyone who has helped them feel safe, loved and valued.
