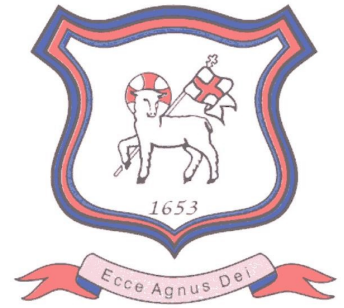

Charging for school trips and enrichment school events

Our children always tell us that they enjoy our school trips and experiences in school and so I would like to thank you for supporting us in providing these for them.

You will notice that in the future, all our invitations for trips or enrichment events that request a voluntary contribution, will have a statement that says " This trip has a voluntary financial contribution of £x which includes entrance fee and transport. However, if we get insufficient contributions, it may be that we have to cancel the trip and all monies will be returned."

We really feel that providing excursions and experiences are important to enrich and enliven the curriculum and as much as possible, school will pay or contribute in order to ensure the experiences go ahead. However, due to constraints on school budgets, this may not always be possible. Our PTFA is also incredibly generous when it comes to subsidising coach travel as this is an increasingly expensive part of the costs. We hope that we will never need to cancel, but we are obliged to inform you of this eventuality within the invitation letter.

DATES AND REMINDERS

Recommended Book Lists for each year

We are often asked about recommended book lists for children of different ages and so I thought we would share with you the Book Trust top 100 recommended books for different age groups. I have added them onto our website under English <http://www.brethertonschool.org.uk/page/english/34929>

Free School Meals and Pupil Premium

If you are a family in receipt of qualifying benefits, your child may be entitled to Free School Meals and an additional pupil premium grant of £1300 which is paid directly to school. If you receive any of the following benefits, you may qualify:

Income Support; Income Support Jobseekers Allowance; Income Related Employment and Support Allowance
Support under part VI of the Immigration Asylum Act 1999; The guaranteed element of state pension credit
Child tax credit (provided you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have a gross income of less than £16190)
Working Tax Credit run on—paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
Universal Credit; Children who get the above credits in their own right

There are also additional categories of pupil premium funding for children who are looked after by the local authority or who have been adopted, and children of service families. If you think you may be eligible, please go to
